11/268 NALC CONFERENCE – POWER SHIFT 2025

The Chief Executive/Town Clerk attended the NALC Conference – Power Shift on 23rd June where she was a speaker (<u>https://www.nalc.gov.uk/events/power-shift-2025/schedule.html</u>) giving a presentation - "Devolution in action: the Yeovil Story".

The conference was about "England's Devolution Revolution", looking at how parish and town councils can drive change, secure vital resources and shape the future of the community.

The English Devolution White Paper was published on 16th December 2024 (English Devolution White Paper - GOV.UK) and talks about growth in every region. It recognises that England is one of the most centralised developed countries which has led to regional inequality. The white paper looks to shift power away from Whitehall and into the hands of those who know their communities.

The Executive Summary states that 'Devolution across England is fundamental to achieving the change the public expect and deserve: growth, more joined-up delivery of public services, and politics being done with communities, not to them. These are all key aspects of this government's Plan for Change. We believe it is only by redistributing political, social and economic power that we will rewire England and allow everyone everywhere to realise their full potential.'

At the conference Mayoral Devolution was discussed and the development of Strategic Authorities. The question of whether this could help the financial crisis in principal authorities was asked. There was the suggestion that greater autonomy and resources from devolution could help parish and town councils maintain essential services.

The Chief Executive/Town Clerk spoke at the conference, highlighting Yeovil Town Council's journey to ensure that services were maintained. She highlighted why it was important that the Council saved the services and facilities that the people of Yeovil valued, the approach, the impact on budget and staffing, the challenges of local devolution and hints and tips about how other local councils could approach their own devolution. There were lots of questions and everyone was inspired by what Yeovil Town Council had achieved in such a small timeframe. The Chief Executive/Town Clerk made many connections with towns and parishes across the country and Yeovil Town Council was identified as a trail blazer of local devolution.
